Proposed 20mph Speed Limit Consultation Results

In June 2021, we consulted on proposals to reduce the speed limit through Sion Village to 20mph. The results of the consultation are summarised here.



335 Responses received

50% of the respondents identified themselves as living in Sion, and 50% as being from outside the village. 1 response was from a visitor to Jersey.

88% of all respondents said they travel in or through Sion daily or at least once a week.

92% of respondents travelling in Sion were car users

57% walk or cycle, or both

32% use the bus

62% were in favour of the proposal to reduce the speed limit

30% were against, and 8% were unsure or did not answer.

Of those living in Sion, 67% were in favour, 25% were against the proposals. Some of the objections were on the grounds that the proposals should be extended.

Of those not living in Sion, 58% were in favour, 36% were against the proposals.

45 comments were included requesting that the 20mph speed limit is extended to the south.

Other comments included complaints about speeding (19), comments about the dangers of walking and cycling (27), requests for driver education and enforcement (14), and requests for a pedestrian crossing (9).

40 people commented that they thought the existing speed limit was appropriate and the reduction to 20mph is unnecessary and would not be enforced.

Based on these results we now propose to implement the 20mph speed limit as previously shown, with an extension to the south as far as the junction with La Rue du Bequet Vincent, as shown on the next page
