Introduction

To change the maximum stay period on Level 2 at Pier Road car park from Monday 7th November to 3 hours.

Recommendation

Select recommendation. The Minister is recommended to approve the temporary introduction of 39 x 3 hour maximum stay shopper parking spaces on level 2 of Pier Road Car Park and to instruct Officers to produce the necessary signage and to advise the public using local media.

Detail

The current works at Ann Court are behind schedule due to Covid and the new shopper car park will not open until 2023 and there has also been a loss of shopper due to the temporary Esplanade car park closing in September 2021. With the approach of the Christmas shopping period and retailers still encountering difficult times Infrastructure, Housing & Environment believe this initiative may help them which can only be beneficial to the general Island economy.

Level 1 in Pier Road car park already has a 3 hour limit which is very popular and it is proposed that from Monday 7th November for a temporary period, spaces on Level 2 are changed to a maximum stay period of 3 hours instead of the current 7 consecutive days to enable their use by shoppers wishing to visit St Helier retailers in the run up to Christmas. If the scheme proves successful it will be continued into 2023 and reviewed when Ann Court car park becomes operational.

Currently Pier Road Car Park has an average of 100 spaces available throughout the day so the loss of the 39 spaces on level 2 will not result in the loss of occupied commuter parking.
