#### Section O – Guidance Notes

#### Licence overview

This annual licence permits the disturbance, taking or killing of Common Pheasant (*Phasianus colchicus*) in order to prevent serious damage<sup>1</sup> to livestock, foodstuffs for livestock, crops, vegetables or fruit.

This licence may be held by a person or by an organisation and may only be used on premises owned or occupied by the licence holder. Users must comply with all licence terms and conditions.

All individuals carrying out shooting activities under this licence must hold a relevant and current firearms certificate under the Firearms (Jersey) Law 2000.

#### When this licence may be used

This licence may only be relied upon where it is strictly necessary to take action for the defined purposes and where reasonable steps to prevent problems by lawful methods have been and continue to be taken.

#### What this licence permits

Subject to the terms and conditions of this licence and solely for the purpose(s) stated above, this licence permits the following activities in relation to Common Pheasant (*Phasianus colchicus*) only:

- a) To disturb, take or destroy eggs
- b) To disturb, take or kill nestlings
- c) To obstruct access to, take and destroy nests whilst in use or being built
- d) To kill an adult bird by shooting, using a using a shotgun of which the barrel has an internal diameter at the muzzle of less than 2.00 centimetres (0.775 inches): 12 gauge or smaller bore

This licence <u>does not</u> permit the selling of dead birds or of eggs of Common Pheasant (*Phasianus colchicus*), for which an application for an individual licence (PL02) would be required.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> 'Serious damage' means damage that exceeds mere nuisance, minor damage or normal business risk. Serious damage <u>does not</u> include problems relating to noise or odour nuisance.

## **Designated Sites**

Areas of Special Protection are areas of land that are designated under the Wildlife (Jersey) Law 2021 to provide legal protection for certain wild animals, birds or plants from disturbance or harm during critical phases of their life cycle. Restrictions on access to and on activities within an Area of Special Protection at certain times may apply.

Natural Sites of Special Interest (SSIs) are places that are designated under the <u>Planning and</u> <u>Building (Jersey) Law 2002 (jerseylaw.je)</u> because of their special zoological, ecological, botanical or geological interest. It is an offence to disturb any wild creature within a Site of Special Interest.

#### **Reporting and Renewal**

This annual licence runs from 1<sup>st</sup> April to 31<sup>st</sup> March and is renewable annually on 1<sup>st</sup> April following submission of a satisfactory report on the work carried out under the licence during the previous term, together with evidence that the firearms certificate has been renewed for the following licence period.

The reporting period is 1<sup>st</sup> January to 1<sup>st</sup> December and reporting must be completed by January 31<sup>st</sup> for the previous year.

# **Application definitions**

#### Applicant

The Applicant is the named individual (or on behalf of an organisation) who is applying for the licence and who would become the licence holder if the licence is granted.

#### **Appointed Person**

The Appointed Person is an employee of the licence holder where the latter is an organisation, who is nominated to act as a single point of contact with regard to this licence.

The Appointed Person is expected to oversee use of the licence, recording keeping and compliance.

#### Lead Agent

The Lead Agent is a person with relevant skills and knowledge who is appointed by the Applicant to undertake and/or oversee the licensed activities. The Lead Agent my also be the Applicant or the Appointed Person.

# **Accredited Agent**

The Accredited Agent is an individual who is authorised by the Applicant to act under this licence without supervision and should only be authorised where the licence holder can personally assure that the individual is appropriately, experienced, skilled and competent to undertake the licence activities.

#### Licence review and payment

The full schedule of fees chargeable for licences under the Wildlife (Jersey) Law 2021, and circumstances in which licences may be exempt from fees, are contained within the <u>Wildlife</u> (Licence Fees) (Jersey) Order 2023 (jerseylaw.je)

Following submission, your application will be reviewed by the Licensing Authority and you will be notified of the decision made via the communication preference given in Section C.

Where the decision to grant a licence has been taken by the Licensing Authority and licence fees are not applicable, the licence will be issued via the communication preference given in Section C.

Where the decision to grant a licence has been taken by the Licensing Authority and licence fees are applicable, further instructions for making payment will be provided and the licence will be issued following successful payment of the licence fee.

If your licence application is unsuccessful, you will not be charged.

Under Article 36(7) of the Law you may request the Minister to reconsider any decision made in relation to the grant of, or refusal to grant a licence, or in relation to any condition specified in a licence. Such request should be submitted in writing to the Minister at the address given above.
