Welcome.

A1. Deputy L.J. Farnham of St. Mary, St. Ouen and St. Peter, Chief Minister, welcomed all present to the first meeting of the Council as newly constituted.

Declarations of interest.

A2. No declarations of interest were received in connexion with any item that was due for discussion at the current meeting.

Forthcoming business.

A3. The Council discussed the following items of public business, which were scheduled to be debated by the States Assembly at the meeting on 27th February 2024 –

Cabinet Office Expenditure Savings (P.8/2024)

Lodged by Deputy M.B. Andrews of St. Helier North. The Council agreed that a comment should be prepared to the effect that work was already underway to review the services that were currently amalgamated under the Cabinet Office.

The point was made that the current composition of the Cabinet Office did not align with the recommendations of the Democratic Accountability and Governance Sub-Committee and that the original intention had been to create a structure which would drive forward Ministerial priorities. The Interim Chief Executive undertook to share details of proposed savings plans for the Cabinet Office. The Head of Ministerial Offices highlighted the potential impact of the debate on staff, but suggested that it might also provide an opportunity to demonstrate support for the work being undertaken by officers; and

Ceasefire in Gaza (P.7/2024)

Lodged by Deputy M. Tadier of St. Brelade. Deputy I.J. Gorst of St. Mary, St. Ouen and St. Peter, Minister for External Relations, acknowledged that the subject was divisive and that opinions would differ within the Council. However, he emphasised that in developing an Amendment, his intention was to endeavour to maintain community cohesion in the Island, whilst simultaneously recognising the constitutional position with the United Kingdom.
