Increase in revenue expenditure for agriculture and fisheries (P.74/2023) – Comments.

A1. The Council of Ministers, with reference to Minute No. A4 of its meeting of 10th October 2023, recalled that the Proposition of Deputy S.G. Luce of Grouville and St. Martin, entitled 'Increase in revenue expenditure for agriculture and fisheries' (P.74/2023 referred), sought an increase of one per cent of all revenue expenditure to be spent on the traditional industries of agriculture and fisheries.

The Council recalled that it acknowledged that agriculture and fisheries played a fundamental role in Jersey's economy and landscape but did not support the allocation of a particular percentage to these areas as it would impinge the ability of future Governments and the States Assembly to determine the allocation of public funds by means of the Government Plan process. The Proposition would also augment the expenditure from the Consolidated fund by £9.14 million in 2024.

The Council accordingly received and noted draft Comments in which its views were set out, approved the same and requested the Secretariat Officer, States Greffe, to arrange for its Comments to be presented to the States Assembly.
