Minutes. A1. The Minutes of the meetings of 23rd January and 6th February 2019 (Part A and Part B), having previously been circulated, were taken as read and were confirmed.

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Matters Arising. A2. The Council, with reference to its Minute No. B2 of 6th February 2019, noted that the final version of the draft Public Finances (Jersey) Law 201- (draft Law) was not yet available for review.

The Minister for Education reminded the Council that she had previously raised questions regarding the role and functions of the Principal Accountable Officer as defined in the draft Law, as well as the interrelationship between the draft Law and existing legislation, including the Employment of States of Jersey Employees (Jersey) Law 2005, which she believed had yet to be addressed.

The Council accordingly decided to delegate approval of the final draft to the Chief Minister and Minister for Treasury and Resources, in consultation with the Ministers for External Relations, Education and the Environment, following which, it was agreed that the draft Law should be lodged '*au Greffe*,' for consideration by the States Assembly, at the earliest opportunity.
