Draft Sexual Offences (Jersey) Law 201-: lodging 'au Greffe.' 1530/99(1) A1. The Council, with reference to its Minute No. B2 of 10th January 2018, considered a revised draft of the Sexual Offences (Jersey) Law 201-, the purpose of which was to make new provision on sexual offences, replacing most, but not all, of the existing statutory and customary law offences, and creating new offences as well as amending provisions on sexual offences in other legislation. It was noted that the Law was not a complete code of sexual offences (in particular it did not cover indecent images, and it preserved the customary law offence of indecent assault), but it did contain much of the relevant Law.

Having noted the revisions which had been made to the draft legislation, as requested at its previous meeting, the Council accordingly supported the draft Law, together with the explanatory report to accompany the projet, and requested the Minister for Home Affairs to proceed to lodging it 'au Greffe' in her name.

The officers were directed to take the necessary action.
