I note that you are to consider fresh plans for the development of the Plemont Headland.

It was extremely disappointing that the States failed to take into account the "line in the sand" and did not agree to protect the Plemont Headland from future development when agreeing the Island Plan. Once again it is refreshing that the National Trust should take upon its self to raise public awareness of the beauty of the headland and the travesty that would come about if the development plans before you are agreed.

Clearly the plans have to be rejected and the States encouraged to explore the purchase by the National Trust or a Trust set up for the purpose, of the Headland for future generations of islanders to enjoy this ecologically fragile landscape.
