HAWAG (Housing and Work Advisory Group) meet every 2 weeks to determine appeals or other applications not decided by Officers (for example substantive applications). The group consists of the Assistant Chief Minister, the Housing Minister, the Assistant Minister for Social Security, and the Assistant Minister for Economic Development.

Appeals (post rejection) are classed differently to applications and timescales are therefore not counted in these figures.

| Licensed | Someone who is an 'Essential Employee' engaged by a <br> specific business with permission to engage such a <br> person | Employer needs permission to employ a 'licensed' <br> person |
| Registered | Someone who does not qualify under the above <br> categories | Employer needs permissions to employ a 'registered' <br> person |
