Income tax relief

for pension contributions up to specified limits



No tax to pay

whilst your pension savings grow in the scheme



Transfer pension funds

domestically or internationally

Accessing your pensions savings



You can start accessing your pension savings/ fund from 50 years old

Scheme must have commenced paying a pension by the time you are 75 years old

Tax free lump sum can be taken in an unlimited number of tranches



Increased flexibility

- In how you take your pension income
- In allowing you to take your pension and carry on working with the same employer
- In accessing your entire pension fund via an approved drawdown contract *as long as you are in receipt of minimum retirement income*



An approved pension scheme may pay

- A pension to any dependant of the pension holder; or
- ${\boldsymbol{\cdot}}$ A lump sum to the pension holder's estate or any other person

What is the tax position?

A pension is taxed at the dependant's marginal rate of tax (just like any other income)

A lump sum is tax free if the pension holder did not receive any payments from the scheme whilst alive and subject to tax at 10% if the pension holder did receive some benefits from the scheme whilst alive.
