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#### Introduction

Items of Pharmaceutical benefit, which can be prescribed in the community by approved prescribers, are maintained on a Prescribed list. Further to Article 15, paragraphs (11) and (12), of the Health Insurance (Jersey) Law 1967, the Minister for Social Security may amend the Prescribed List, having consulted with the Pharmaceutical Benefit Advisory Committee.

### Recommendation

Items to be added to the Prescribed List Primidone 50mg tablets for treatment of epilepsy. Diltiazem modified release 90mg capsules for treatment and prevention of angina and treatment of high blood pressure. Trimbow pressurised metered-dose inhaler (containing beclometasone dipropionate 172microgram/formoterol fumarate dihydrate 5micrograms/glycopyrronium bromide 9micrograms) for treatment of asthma.
 Items to be removed from the Prescribed List that are now discontinued. (Alternative products are available on the List where necessary). Diflucortolone 0.1% cream, Diflucortolone 0.3% oily cream / 0.3% ointment, Glutaraldehyde 10% solution, Ephedrine 0.5% nasal drops

#### **Detail**

The Minister decided to make amendments to the Prescribed List with effect from 1 December 2022 following recommendations made by the Pharmaceutical Benefit Advisory Committee on 15 September 2022. There is no overall change in net annual expenditure.
